#### A WORD FROM PASTOR WADE

Hola from Utila, Honduras my friends! I have the honor to be down here with seven terrific people. Three from Wesley, including Dana Timaeus, Rob Jones, and Billy Kinney, along with Jay Wilson Sr. of Joaquin, TX, Jay Wilson Jr. of Orange, Daniel Graff of Richmond, VA, and Dana's daughter, Sarah, of Indianapolis. Monday, 6/10, brought a day of travel that was an adventure in and of itself. The first flight from Houston to San Pedro Sula, Honduras was uneventful, but then the group was split up with four getting to take a direct flight to Utila and three flying to a town on the mainland across from Utila called La Ceiba. I happened to be one of the three taking the indirect route, which I didn't mind as it is all part of the adventure. Adding further to



the experience was when we received news that we three were going to be taking the ferry to get to the island. As you will see in the pictures, the ferry ride was enjoyable and provided a unique perspective of Utila as we came into the harbor.



This week, as in many of the past trips, we are working in connection with the local Methodist Church, the church's pastor-Rev. Esther, the medical clinic, and the Utila Methodist Community College or UMCC. The UMCC is a school that provides education for students from their start in pre-k through when they graduate high school after the 11th grade. Two of our group, Jay Sr. and Sarah, are getting to teach at the school, with Sarah also working at the clinic. The rest of us are working at the UMCC to set up a room that is being converted into a computer lab for the students. This is quite the task, but the group is amazing me with all the skills they have, making the job move forward over each hurdle along the way. Please pray that we complete our task so that the group coming directly after us can start work on the next step so that the computer lab can be up and running as soon as possible. I also ask for prayer for our group, the UMCC, the Church, and the people of Utila.

Remember from a few weeks ago I made the following statement in my sermon about mission work: "A Disciple is someone who has moved from being the recipient of the Church's Mission to being responsible for the Church's Mission." On this trip, I am getting to work alongside many who have taken these words to heart. We know though that we couldn't be here without all the support of the Wesley Family. A Family, full of disciples of Jesus Christ who see the practical and spiritual needs of people and do something about them in so many ways. My encouragement is to keep up the good work and do all you can to be in Mission both in Beaumont and around the world. Look for ways you can help with the Garage Sale, CTCYM, UM Army, Quest Ranch, Lakeview, Verge, and so many other Mission type activities going on this summer at Wesley.


